

Energy Use Reduction Policy

This energy reduction policy identifies the key principles for improving energy use from our direct operations and our stakeholders.

Specific to energy use and associated emissions Hobart Airport is committed to engage, educate, and collaborate with our staff, contractors, tenants, and stakeholders to balance environmental, social, and business needs as we operate and grow.

Our long-term goal is to reduce energy use and emissions within our operations and also among our stakeholders- this will be achieved through the following principles:

- We will actively promote stakeholder awareness of energy and emissions reduction opportunities
- We will support our stakeholders in the implementation of energy reduction actions.
- We will minimise our environmental and emissions impact by integrating sustainability principles and continual improvement into our decision making- including planning, design, development, service delivery and procurement processes.
- Hobart Airport is committed to achieving nett zero emissions from operations within its direct control (scope 1 and 2 emissions).
- Emissions which cannot reasonably be reduced are offset each year. We will continue to prioritise the purchase of quality, biodiverse rich, Tasmanian carbon credits.
- To facilitate emissions reductions for our stakeholders, we are committed to actively engaging with tenants and stakeholders to increase awareness of and support the achievement of energy efficiency and sustainability practices.

This policy will be reviewed every two years.
